## Music Camp Information

Campers for the Texas Music $犬 8$ Arts Camps are selected from Salvation Army churches throughout the state, and the main goal of this program is to equip campers, both musically and spiritually, to be able to add to the live worship at their home church.

Junior Music Conservatory - for ages 7-11
Texas Youth and Music Institute - for ages 7-17
Senior Music Conservatory - for ages 12-17

These are overnight camping programs, so all campers and staff are required to live at camp for the scheduled duration.

Junior Music Conservatory is a week-long program for up to 80 children ages 7 -11. During this week each campers work in a brass band, and learning a camp musical which is performed at the end of the camp graduation.

Texas Youth and Music Institute is a week-long program youth ages 7-11. During this week each camper works in music classes and bible classes. Each day we have left

## Senior Conservatory

The Texas Senior Conservatory of Music and Arts is a three week program. The goal of the Conservatory is to train young people in the arts so they can be used for worship. Our ultimate aim is for everyone, students and staff alike, to deepen their relationship with Christ.
The Conservatory features seven majors that focus on elements of worship that should be present every Sunday in Salvation Army worship services.

- Brass
- Guitar
- Piano
- Percussion
- Dance
- Guitar

Students choose from these Major classes and attend them along with other classes within the scheduleChoir, Music Theory, Electives (these classes change each year) and Bible Study. In the evenings we end the day with a fun night program or a student recital along with Recreation games and some fun pool time.


## Music Staff Expectations

## Instructional Staff

Instructors are asked to help lead all classes based on their experience and interest. For band, instructors will either be asked to help lead, or will play in the ensembles to serve as an extra set of eyes and ears for more one-on-one instruction. If an instructor's expertise is in dance, drama, guitar, or piano, they will be assigned to help with those classes instead.

Instructors will participate in chorus, but will more than likely not be asked to teach (unless they have a choral emphasis).

All instructors will be asked to teach theory, private lessons, sectionals, and electives.

Electives will be assigned based on the skills of each instructor. Some past electives have been:

- praise band
- jazz ensemble
- piano
- handbells
- percussion ensemble

All classes are team-taught, so there are at least two instructors in each class. The instructors get free time and recreation periods off to rest from their otherwise full day of teaching.

## Counselor Duties

Counselors need to have an interest and/or ability in music, but will not be asked to teach. (Depending on the need and talents of the applicant, some counselors might be asked to have a light teaching role.)

They will participate in most classes to help with supervision and will also give individual instruction to the campers around them. Their main responsibility is to supervise the campers in the cabin, in between classes, and during unstructured time (meals, free time, recreation, etc.). Counselors typically get two to three class periods off per day to rest, whereas the instructors get free time and recreation off because they are teaching all day.


## Other Staff Information

## Days Off

Since our camp goes for 6 weeks straight (including orientation week). Throughout the summer we'll assign days off. We'll do this on a rotating basis so that we always have enough staff on hand to meet our safety ratios. There will be three days off per staff member.

There are no days off on the last week, as we prepare for the final graduation concert. On days off, staff members can go into town for meals, movies, shopping, etc., or they are welcome to stay at camp and rest.

If you are hired you will receive these assigned days a few weeks before camp begins.

## Other Expectations

First and foremost, The Salvation Army is a Christian church. It is not a requirement for employees to be Christian, but we do expect employees to uphold and demonstrate moral behavior and standards while working at camp.

Staff members are expected to attend Bible Study every morning with the campers. Also, they are not allowed to smoke, drink, use bad language, or participate in inappropriate relationships while working for The Salvation Army during the summer.

## Compensation

Every staff member is responsible for his/her way to camp. Staff members are welcome to drive to camp, and will be able to park their cars at no charge. While at camp, accommodations and meals will be included, and we also have laundry facilities.

Counselors will live in the cabin (in a separate counselor room) and instructors stay in staff lodging facilities. We also provide several staff t-shirts which employees wear every day (other than orientation and days off).

Salaries for counselors and instructors start at $\$ 325 / \mathrm{wk}$. and can possibly increase based on experience and qualifications.
